

CHRIST THE KING The Sunday Next Before Advent Sunday, November 22nd 2020



Dear Friends,

One of the very difficult realities of our present situation is uncertainty. These uncertainties are both large and small. Clearly the most significant are the deep anxieties for those who contract the coronavirus, their families and loved ones. The painful symptoms of that uncertainty are revealed in isolation and the many ways we are having to adjust our lives, make sacrifices, to stay safe and protect the lives of others. The economic uncertainties are clearly very hard to bear also, especially for those whose businesses, livelihoods or homes are under threat because of the present lack of economic activity. There are clearly many, many more personal uncertainties for us all.

All these uncertainties are profoundly related to risk, and how we view risk. Constantly in our news channels discussions are presented about policy. Many of these oscillate around the questions of how we balance all these uncertainties and the risks that go with our present pandemic. Beneath the arguments and debates are usually differing attitudes towards uncertainty and risk. Some of these discussions, I believe, could feel less sterile if we were able to be more honest about how we have differing underlying views about such risks, rather than just engaging in a game where speakers only find and concentrate on those statistics which support their own pre-determined polemic. Risk is actually a part of our everyday lives, and we make decisions constantly to manage those risks. However, it is clear that the risks this pandemic poses both to individuals and the proper functioning of our lives are so high that we are rightly taking extraordinary steps to mitigate and contain them. At the same time, it is not unreasonable to ask at what point the symptoms of these mitigations become as costly as the virus itself both in the short and medium term.

As a Church we are presently in a deeply uncertain place on many levels, which parallels both our individual and corporate lives. In the immediate future this particularly relates to how we

are going to celebrate Christmas. We are in a position presently where it is not possible to make any definite decisions about the shape of our Christmas services. Much of this will depend upon the trajectory of the virus and the decisions our government makes about our present lockdown, and what mitigations will remain in place as Christmas approaches even if our general lockdown is lifted. The pivotal decision for us will be around the extent to which we will be able to return to our church buildings for corporate worship and the mitigations which will remain around this, especially in terms of numbers who can gather and what singing will be allowed.

At this stage all I can ask for is your patience. Clearly, as guidance emerges both from government and the church we will respond as speedily as we can. Presuming some form of physical, corporate worship in the Church building is allowed we will then release this information through this channel. Given that numbers are likely to be limited, I will then state clearly from what date people can request to attend a particular service. However, when those services will be, in what form, and how many people can attend, all remain deeply uncertain, and until a clear way forward emerges we can only wait patiently.

Nominations for all positions are open to anyone who is on the Electoral Roll of St Margaret's and who satisfies the other requirements specified on the nomination forms. Churchwardens are elected annually and may stand for six consecutive periods of office. PCC members and Deanery Synod representatives are elected for a period of three years.

The existing Deanery Synod members will continue in position until 31st December 2020. From 1st January 2021 the structure of the Deanery Synod will change, whereby we can have 5 members from St Margaret's. Those elected, automatically become members of the PCC.
