Collect

Almighty and everlasting God, who in your tender love towards the human race sent your Son our Saviour Jesus Christ to take upon him our flesh and to suffer death upon the cross: grant that we may follow the example of his patience and humility, and also be made partakers of his resurrection; through Jesus Christ your Son our Lord, who is alive and reigns with you, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, now and for ever. **Amen.**

First Reading Isaiah 50. 4 – 9a

A reading from the prophecy of Isaiah.

The Lord God has given me the tongue of a teacher, that I may know how to sustain the weary with a word. Morning by morning he wakens – wakens my ear to listen as those who are taught. The Lord God has opened my ear, and I was not rebellious, I did not turn backwards. I gave my back to those who struck me, and my cheeks to those who pulled out the beard; I did not hide my face from insult and spitting.

The Lord God helps me; therefore I have not been disgraced; therefore I have set my face like flint, and I know that I shall not be put to shame; he who vindicates me is near. Who will contend with me? Let us stand up together. Who are my adversaries? Let them confront me. It is the Lord God who helps me; who will declare me guilty?

Gradual Psalm Psalm 31. 9 – 16

- 9 Have mercy on me, Lord, for I am in trouble;
 my eye is consumed with sorrow, my soul and my body also.
- 10 For my life is wasted with grief, and my years with sighing;
 my strength fails me because of my affliction, and my bones are consumed.
- 11 I have become a reproach to all my enemies and even to my neighbours, an object of dread to my acquaintances;
 when they see me in the street they flee from me.
- 12 I am forgotten like one that is dead, out of mind;
 I have become like a broken vessel.
- 13 For I have heard the whispering of the crowd; fear is on every side;
 they scheme together against me, and plot to take my life.
- 14 But my trust is in you, O Lord.
 I have said, 'You are my God.
- 15 'My times are in your hand;

- 16 'Make your face to shine upon your servant,
 and save me for your mercy's sake.'

Gospel Reading Mark 11. 1 - 11

When Jesus and his disciples were approaching Jerusalem, at Bethphage and Bethany, near the Mount of Olives, he sent two of his disciples and said to them, 'Go into the village ahead of you, and immediately as you enter it, you will find tied there a colt that has never been ridden; untie it and bring it. If anyone says to you, "Why are you doing this?" just say this, "The Lord needs it and will send it back here immediately.'" They went away and found a colt tied near a door, outside in the street. As they were untying it, some of the bystanders said to them, 'What are you doing, untying the colt?' They told them what Jesus had said; and they allowed them to take it. Then they brought the colt to Jesus and threw their cloaks on it; and he sat on it. Many people spread their cloaks on the road, and others spread leafy branches that they had cut in the fields. Then those who went ahead and those who followed were shouting, 'Hosanna! Blessed is the one who comes in the name of the Lord! Blessed is the coming kingdom of our ancestor David! Hosanna in the highest heaven!'

Then he entered Jerusalem and went into the temple; and when he had looked around at everything, as it was already late, he went out to Bethany with the twelve.

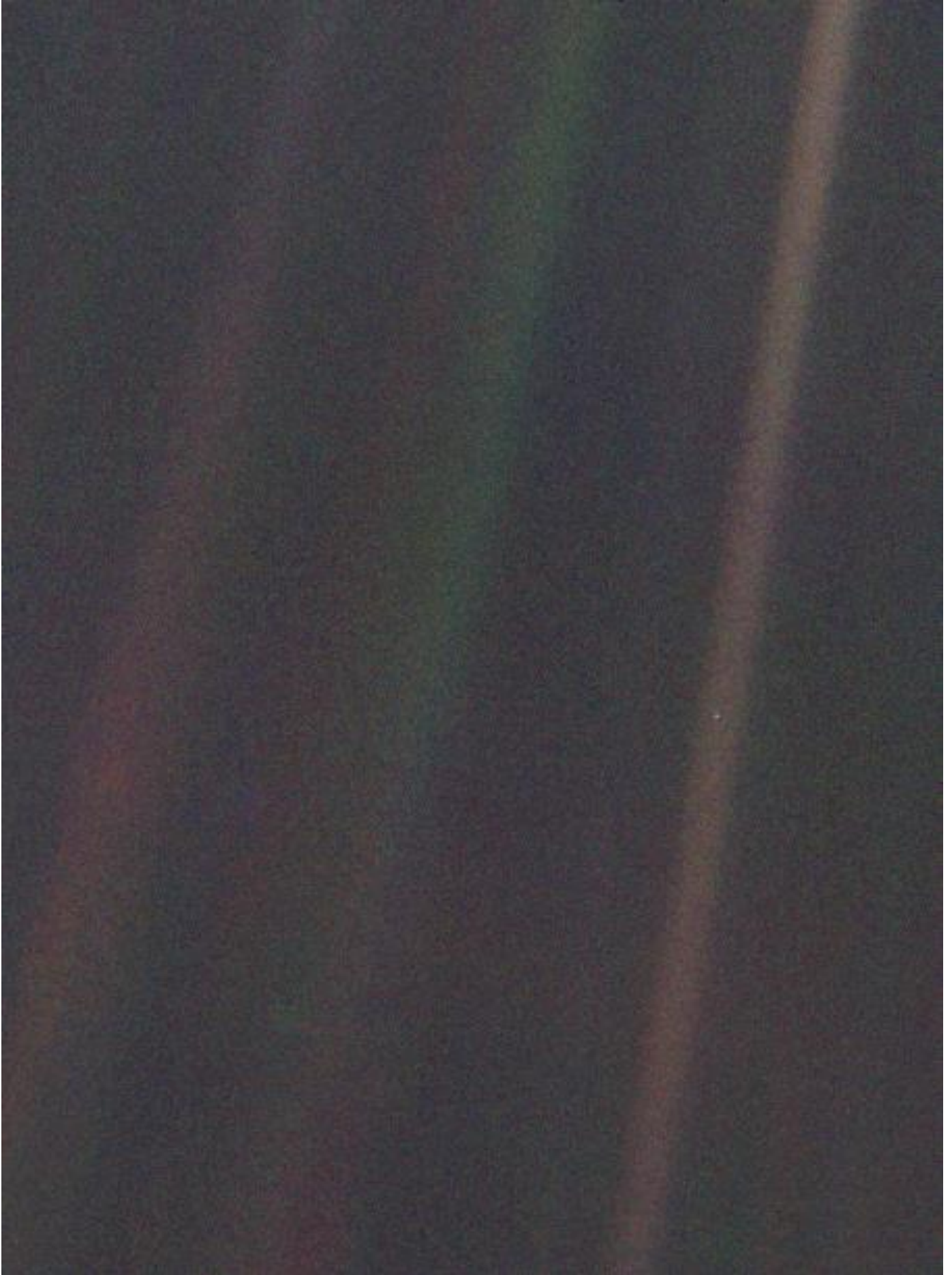
Post Communion Prayer

Organ Recital

Friday 5 April, 12.30 pm

The recital on Friday 5 April is an all-English affair, culminating in the first movement of Basil Harwood's splendid youthful Sonata In C sharp minor (1886) – a sort of amalgam of Rheinberger and Elgar. The rest of the programme consists of chorale preludes by Leighton and Ridout (both 1977), two short pieces by Noel Rawsthorne (both c. 1999), and a Canzona (1957) by Herbert Sumsion, long organist of Gloucester Cathedral whose lovely music is often sung by our church choir. A gorgeous Barcarolle by William Lloyd Webber and a fanfare Sir Arthur Bliss complete the line-up.
